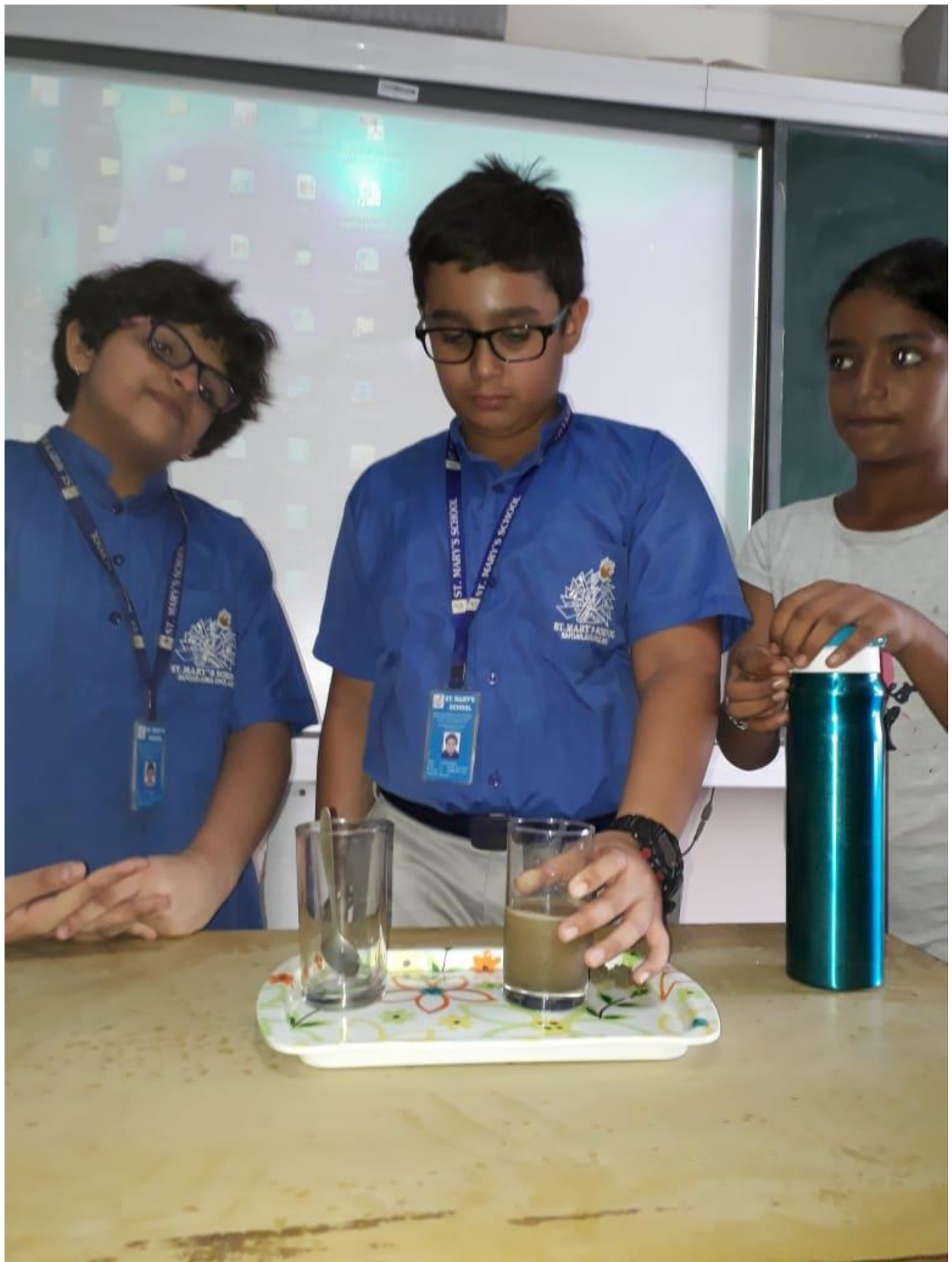

WINNOWING PROCESS

Winnowing is an ancient method developed by ancient cultures for separating grain from chaff. It is also used to remove any and other pests from stored grain. The loosening of chaff or seeds from the stalk and straw is called winnowing.

What is Winnowing?

Winnowing is a process of separating grain from chaff. It is a traditional method used in agriculture. The grain is thrown into the air, and the lighter chaff is blown away by the wind, leaving the heavier grain behind.
