Introduction

The medical camp organized on 25th July, 2024 at Jaat Chaupal, Mohammadpur, was a collaborative effort aimed at providing free medical services to the local community. This report outlines the planning, execution, and outcomes of the camp, emphasizing the learnings and experiences gained by students involved in the process.

Objective of the Camp

The primary objective of the medical camp was to offer free medical consultations and services to the local community, promoting health awareness and providing essential healthcare support. Additionally, the camp aimed to educate students about organizing large-scale events and the importance of community service.

➤ **Ideas**

The medical camp began with a comprehensive planning phase that included a variety of engaging activities aimed at promoting health awareness. The students were divided into different committees, such as the program committee, finance committee, designing committee etc. To ensure widespread awareness and participation, flyers advertising the medical camp were distributed in the local Mohammadpur community. These flyers contained essential details about the camp, including the date, time, location, and services offered.



Additionally, a rally was organized to further promote the event. Students were gathered and prepared to participate in this rally, which aimed to attract attention and gather a crowd for the medical camp.

➤ **Site Review**

The chosen site for the medical camp was Jaat Chaupal, Mohammadpur, a location previously used by the school for similar events was thoroughly reviewed to assess its capacity and suitability for hosting the camp. This included evaluating the placement of necessary departments and equipment, ensuring proper ventilation, and addressing weather-related concerns. Essential amenities such as water coolers, fans,

seating arrangements, and congestion management were meticulously planned to provide a comfortable environment for both the attendees and the medical staff.



➤ Design Team

The design team played a crucial role in the pre-event preparations. They were responsible for creating visually appealing posters for the rally, designing banners for the site, and crafting informative flyers for distribution. The team worked diligently to ensure that all promotional materials were attractive, informative, and aligned with the overall theme of health and wellness.

➤ Finding Doctors

Securing the participation of qualified doctors was a vital aspect of the medical camp's success. Fortunately, the school was able to enlist the help of three distinguished doctors, all of whom are parents of students studying at the school. Dr. Tanu Sanyal, an MBBS, DGO(LHMC), Family Physician, and Gynaecologist, provided her services from 9 AM to 12:30 PM. Dr. Alok Kumar, an MBBS with a Diploma in Anesthesiology and a Consultant in Cardiac Anesthesia, was available from 9 AM to 11 AM. Lastly, Dr. M. A. Hussain, the Chief Medical Officer (NFSG), offered his expertise from 11 AM to 12:30 PM. Their participation was instrumental in ensuring that a wide range of medical services could be offered during the camp.

★ During the Event

➤ Organizing the Setup

On the day of the event, meticulous organization was key to ensuring a smooth setup. Various departments and equipment were strategically placed according to the predetermined plan. The team worked efficiently to arrange the seating, venue, and other essential facilities, ensuring a welcoming and comfortable environment for all attendees.

➤ Gathering of People

The rally, combined with the distribution of flyers, successfully gathered a significant number of people from the community. The enthusiastic participation of students in the rally drew considerable attention, leading to a substantial turnout at the medical camp.

We learned how to ensure smooth working of plans despite opposing conditions out of our control as well as noted key pointers in planning to assist us in our future events.

➤ **Feedback**

Feedback was collected from attendees, students, and volunteers to assess the event's success and identify improvement areas. The general response was overwhelmingly positive, with many appreciating free medical services and the well-organized nature of the camp.
