

TEACHERS' TRAINING (DAY 3)

Mapping the objectives with Task

8th July, 2017 was the third and the last day of teacher's training before the school reopens but it was very fruitful. It was an amazing learning experience for all of us. Mrs. Kalpana Kapoor was the resource person for the day.

She started the workshop by distributing different objects to all groups and she asked us to imagine the object as a child and write its qualities. Here we learnt that we should always look for those qualities in a child which help him becoming a good person.



Then we discussed the revised Bloom's Taxonomy, its different levels and the verbs associated with each level. We know lesson plans and worksheets are part and parcel of teaching process and she helped us in making them more effective.

After that she gave each group an activity and we were asked to write the learning objectives using Bloom's verbs. After discussing the objectives written by different groups, we developed a better understanding about how to develop lesson plans that integrate Bloom's Taxonomy. We also learned that by using Bloom's Taxonomy in the classroom, we can assess students on multiple learning outcomes.

There is a saying – A good teacher is one who gives a good question to his students rather than a good answer or if you want to know about a teacher without interacting with him than just look at his question paper.

Her discussion about Bloom's Taxonomy helped us in increasing the quality of our question papers.

In the last segment of the workshop she asked some teachers to role play as different animals. She narrated the story of a jungle and the teachers acted accordingly and that was really fun and interesting.

It was really an interesting and an enriching experience for all of us.
