2. To deepen social, historical and mathematical knowledge through experiential learning.





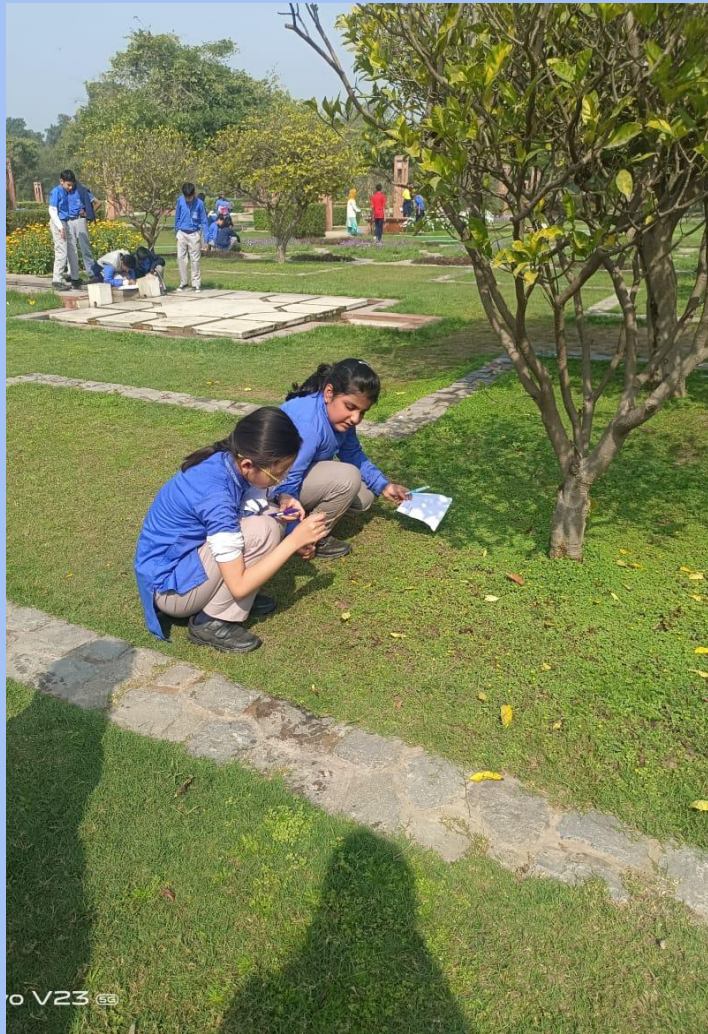

Overall, it was an enriching experience for the children.





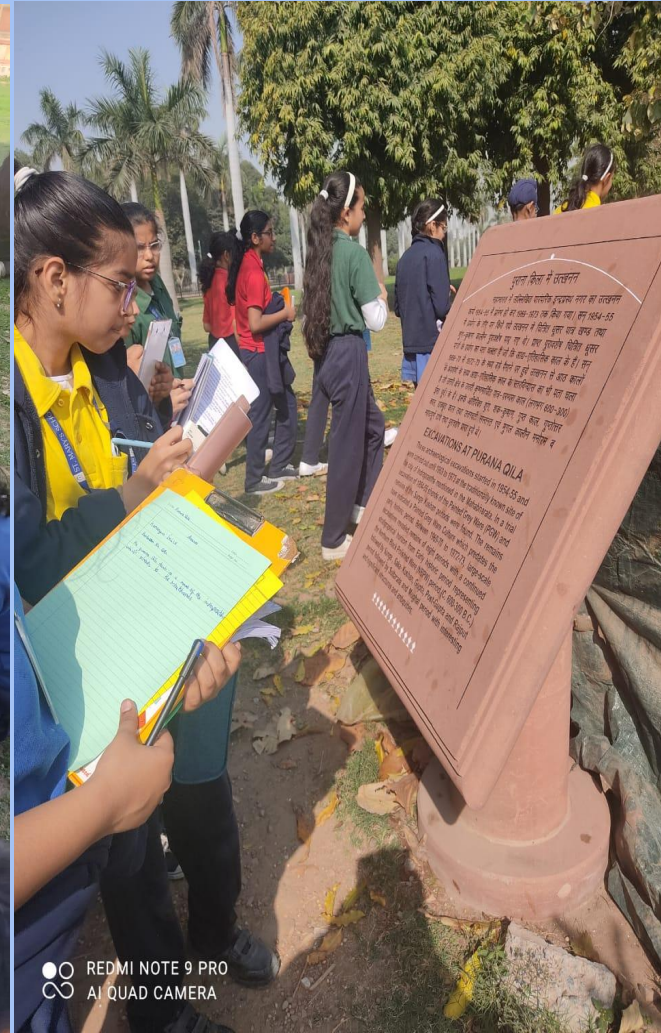


# CLASS VI VISIT TO PURANA QILA
